
Ways to "Flip the Script"

This game is fun to play when boredom sets in, plus it provides a fun and acceptable way to be both negative and sickeningly optimistic.

After deciding who will be the angel and who will be the demon, the demon starts with a complaint ("Ugh, it's raining outside") and the angel tries to turn it into a positive by giving a reason to be optimistic ("Yeah, but that rain will help the flowers grow.")

The fun comes when either side has to try and overcome the other's opinion using reason ("Yeah, but flowers have pollen which give me allergies" ... "But allergies are nature's way of keeping vour nose clean.")

The round is over when a player can't provide a reason ("Yeah, but...but...). The roles then switch and the next round begins with a different complaint.

DICITAL CUESS WHO

Guess Who is a game where two players each have an identical set of images - usually 25 cartoon faces. After each player randomly selects a character, they take turns asking each other yes-or-no questions: "Does she have a hat?" in order to guess the character "Your character is Susan!".

Let's play the same game, but this time each player has the same website--allowing you to play over the phone or text.

For younger learners they can ask about physical characteristics: "Does your character have brown hair?" While older players can ask about biographic information: "Does your character look for planetary biosignatures?" (hint,
